Corrections in the 20-page Document

- On the left side of page 12, at the bottom of the right column, note that the current fiscal year (July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024) budget was projected to be a (\$14,588.35) loss. When the budget was prepared in the spring of 2023, the Parish Finance Council noted the reason for the deficit budget was "due to church finances and the volatility of the current economy." Today, with a little more than two months left in the budget year the Parish Finance Council now reports that parish financial support is meeting the current budget, if not slightly ahead of budget.
- On page 16 it should be noted that 50% of the total proposed project must be in cash and secured in a separate, interest bearing account, before the Diocese of Superior will allow St. Patrick's to begin the project.
- On the right side of page 18, the second article describing Required Minimum Distribution, should say 73 or older **not** 72 or older. In the next paragraph, change \$100,000 to \$105,000 and \$200,000 to \$210,000. Thank you.
